# J-Style

JAPANESE FASHION EXHIBITION



In the final week of September, LCCA hosted the J-Style Japanese Fashion exhibition at The Gallery in 9 Holborn. There, photographers Emily Faulder and Saoirse Clohessy were joined by illustrators Madeleine Allcock and Tania Piccolo, and designer and illustrator Rosie Sweetheart. Fashion brand, ShinkuRose, were also at the exhibition. Together Emily and Saoirse curated the exhibition which celebrated the influence of Japanese street fashion in the UK. They explored Harajuku fashion through different mediums and held a raffle, with donations going to the charity, Raleigh International. Special guest, singer-songwriter Megan Valentine, performed an acoustic set on the closing night along with guitarist Touma (Tomás Eduardo), singing both original songs and covers. LCCA was delighted to welcome photography alumna, Emily, back to campus for this special exhibition. She described the private viewing of the exhibition as kawaii, creative and colourful.

"The project as a whole was a fantastic experience. Seeing months of hard work come together on the night and people having a great time and enjoying our work was so rewarding."

The J-Style exhibition was certainly different to more conventional exhibitions in the UK.

"Japanese street fashion is quite niche but has a huge cult following in the UK," Emily explained. "As far as we are aware, no one has put together an exhibition celebrating Japanese street fashion before in the UK, and we knew from the outset that it would attract a lot of attention."

Emily introduced Saoirse: "The exhibition was Saoirse's brainchild. We have been friends for a while and met through our love of photographing J-fashion. When she suggested an exhibition to me, I jumped at the chance. Originally it was just going to be photography but it morphed into something much more creative and visually exciting."

Saoirse explained the charity fundraising: "[It] was part of my personal fundraising to visit Nepal with Raleigh International Charity as their project manager and expedition photographer."

"Last year, I decided that fashion retouching wasn't for me. I wanted to do charity work whilst using my creativity and, when I saw this role, it just seemed exactly what I wanted to do. Not only do Raleigh focus on sustainable development and environmental work, but also women's rights, which I am very passionate about. I'm only out there for three months but it will be a step towards a career in the charity sector."

Seamstress and administrator, Debole, and designer and pattern cutter, Emily, make up the small team of ShinkuRose.

This alternative fashion brand designs garments and accessories in the style of Lolita fashion and kawaii fashion. ShinkuRose also specialises in hand rendered illustrations and real life photography, which is incorporated into their art work in the form of print designs.

ShinkuRose started as an Etsy marketplace store in 2012; today they visit shows around England and Europe.

## UNMISSABLE UK FESTIVALS THIS SUMMER

Imagine wading through mud, sleeping in a tent, and not being able to shower for several days. It may not sound enjoyable, but hundreds of thousands of people flock to British festivals every year – they are a huge part of UK culture, and manage to attract visitors from all around the world. Not all festivals involve not-so-fun sounding aspects listed below, but they are all wonderful in their own way. Here are six unmissable UK festivals coming up this summer.

### CREAMFIELDS

Held over the bank holiday weekend, this is the largest dance music festival in the UK, and features both live acts and DJs. This year, Creamfields is turning 20, and looks to come back bigger and better than ever before in celebration of its big 2-0. Winner of the Best Major Festival award at the UK Festival Awards last year, the four-day dance extravaganza is held in Daresbury, Cheshire. This year's line-up includes deadmau5, Fatboy Slim, The Chainsmokers and Pendulum.

### FRINGE

This year, the Edinburgh Fringe Festival is celebrating its 70th anniversary in style. The Fringe is the biggest arts festival in the world, held in many different venues across the Scottish capital, and prides itself on presenting shows for every taste. From theatre, dance and opera, to physical cabaret, circus and even children's shows, there's something to suit people of all ages with all kinds of interests. This year, the Fringe will run from 4 to 28 August – that's 25 days of art appreciation. And what's more, lots of the events are free! Head over to their official website for a full programme of live acts.

### ISLE OF WIGHT

The Isle of Wight Festival started as a counterculture event in the late 1960s and, in 1971, Parliament added a section to the Isle of Wight County Council Act 1971 stating that no overnight, open-air gatherings of more than 5,000 people would be allowed on the island without a licence from the council. However, in 2002, the festival came back with a vengeance. It's now one of the biggest music festivals in the country, and this year's line-up boasts acts such as David Guetta, Run DMC and Rod Stewart.

### V FESTIVAL

V Festival takes place over two days in two different locations: Hylands Park, Chelmsford, and Weston Park, Shifnal. One line-up plays one venue, while a separate line-up plays the other, then the two swap around the following day. The idea came when Jarvis Cocker said that he would love to play two outdoor venues in two days, back in 1996. V offers a great variety of music, from pop and RnB, to rock and rap. This year's performers include Jay Z, Pink, Jason Derulo and Madness.

### LATITUDE

Thought to be more similar to continental European festivals than others held in the UK, Latitude Festival encompasses music, theatre, comedy, cabaret, poetry, politics, dance and literature. With hundreds of performances split across several stages, Latitude has something for everyone. Held in Henham Park, near Southwold, Suffolk, Mumford and Sons, Goldfrapp and The 1975 all feature in this year's line-up.

### GLASTONBURY

It may be one of the world's most famous music festivals but, believe it or not, Glastonbury isn't just about the music – there's comedy, circus, and many weird and wonderful places to explore and things to discover. Held in Pilton, Somerset, in late June, Glastonbury Festival began as Pilton Festival in the 1970s before growing into the music Mecca it is today. Known for keeping the majority of its line-up under wraps until much closer to the festival opening, Foo Fighters and Radiohead are the only acts confirmed so far this year. The festival will run from 21 to 25 June.



# Great & Irish British Saints

Every year, each country in the United Kingdom (along with Ireland) celebrates their patron saint day. You may well know the names of these saints, but you might not know who they actually were. Here are four short introductions to the saints of Wales, Ireland, England and Scotland.

## St. Andrew - Scotland (November 17)

Not much is known of Andrew's life but he is said to have been born in Bethsaida, a village on the Sea of Galilee. A fisherman by trade, Andrew is thought to have lived with Jesus at Capernaum towards the beginning of Jesus' public life, becoming one of Jesus' original 12 apostles.

It is thought that Andrew then travelled to Greece, where he preached Christianity, but was eventually crucified in Patras on an X-shaped cross. This cross is represented by the diagonal white cross on Scotland's flag.

St Andrew's only known connection to Scotland are the rumours that suggest his remains were kept in the town which has since been renamed St Andrews. Andrew is also the patron saint of Greece and Russia.

## St. George - England (April 17)

While there are very few details regarding George's life, he was thought to have been a high ranking officer in the Roman army. It is believed that Emperor Diocletian tortured George in an attempt to force him to deny his faith in Christ. However, George is said to have resisted, and was eventually beheaded in Palestine around 303 AD; his head was buried in a Roman church.

The most famous tale of St George is of his heroic battle with a dragon. The story goes that George killed the dragon on top of a fat-topped hillock in Uffington, Berkshire, aptly named Dragon Hill. Atop the hill is a patch where no grass grows; legend says that this is where the dragon's blood was spilled.

However, there is no evidence to suggest that anything of the sort actually happened. In fact, it's highly unlikely that George ever even visited England.

## St. Patrick - Ireland (March 17)

Born in Roman Britain, Patrick was reportedly captured by Irish pirates in his early teens and taken to Ireland, where he was kept as a sheep herder. Back then, Ireland was run by Druids and pagans, and Patrick turned to God.

It is believed that Patrick was held captive until he was twenty years of age, when he escaped after receiving a dream from God, being told to flee to the coast and leave Ireland for good. He was found by sailors, who took him back to Britain, and Patrick was reunited with his family.

Several years later, Patrick had a vision in which he was handed a letter by a man named Victorious, urging him to return to Ireland. Patrick studied for priesthood under St Germanus, and was ordained a bishop and sent to take the Gospel to Ireland.

In 433, Patrick arrived in Slane and it is strongly believed that a chieftain of one of the druid tribes carried out his attempted murder. With God's intervention, Patrick supposedly converted the chieftain and travelled the country to preach.

After years spent suffering and living in poverty, Patrick died on March 17 461 at Saul, the place where he built the first Irish church.

## St. David - Wales (March 1)

David was allegedly born near Capel Non, on the south west coast of Wales, atop a cliff in the middle of a thunderstorm. Child of Sandde, Prince of Powys and Non, daughter of a chieftain of Menevia, you can find ancient chapel ruins and a holy well at the spot where David was born.

Educated at the monastery of Hen Ffynw, David became a priest and legend says that he performed several miracles, one of which was successfully restoring St Paulinus' sight. It's also believed that David told soldiers to wear leeks in their hats during battle against the Saxons, making them easily recognisable. This is said to be why the leek is one of Wales' national emblems.

David travelled across Wales and the rest of Britain, founding 12 monasteries including Glastonbury and one at Menevia (St. David's), eventually being named Archbishop of Wales at the Synod of Brevi in 550.

St David died on 1 March 589 AD, reportedly aged over 100. He was buried in a 6th century cathedral which was raided by Vikings in the 11th century. The celebration of St David dates back to the 12th century, and nowadays involves singing traditional songs and feasting on Welsh fruit bread and cake.

While we wait in anticipation for their follow-up to debut album *Communion*, Years & Years have dropped the sparkling video for single "Meteorite".

The video sees frontman Olly Alexander in a self-imagined outfit, studded with 86,000 Swarovski crystals created by costume and fashion designer Lara Jensen. Alexander and bandmates Mikey Goldsworthy and Emre Türkmen lead a growing number of dancers in an iridescent, ritualistic dance for "Meteorite".

Taken from the soundtrack to 'Bridget Jones' Baby', this is the first track the trio have released in over a year. 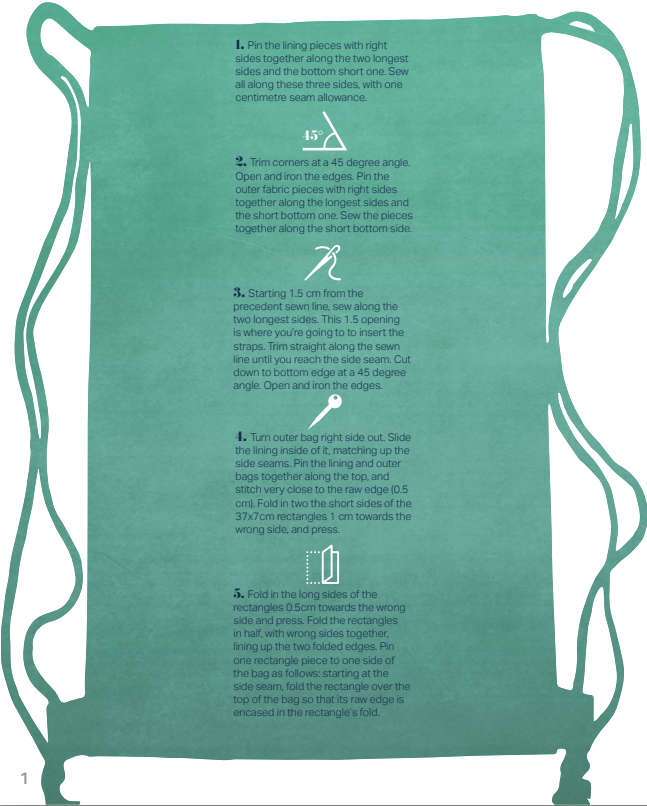

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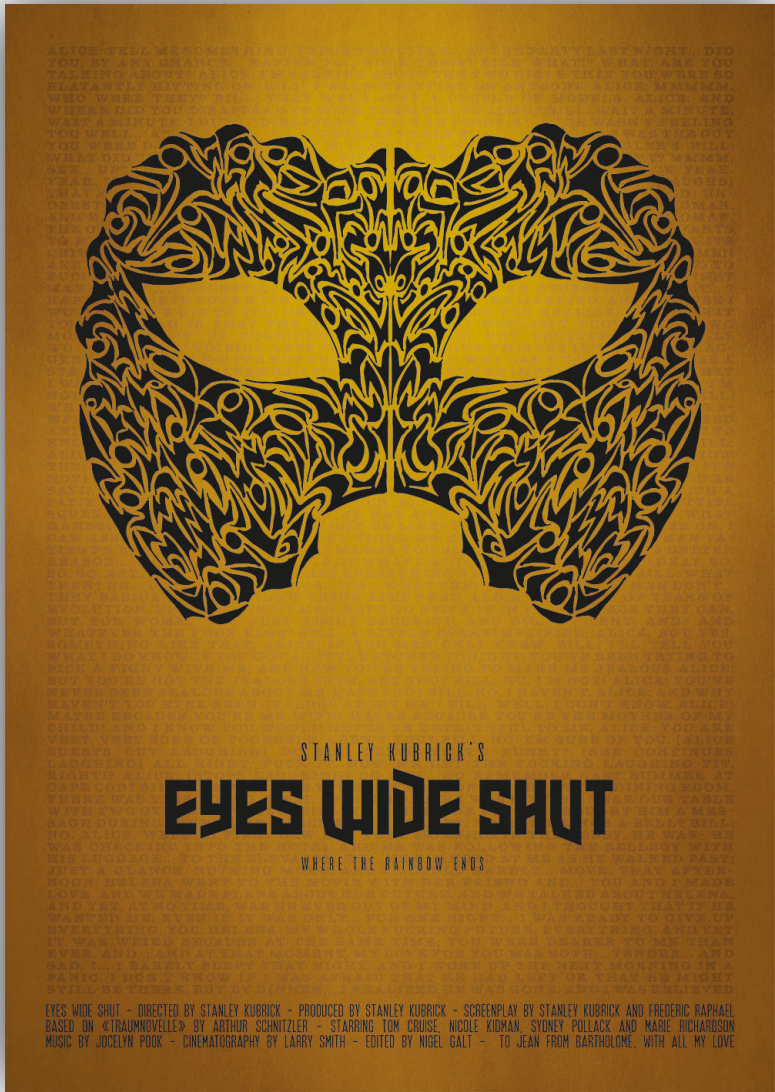
